There is no data available for this product.
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Alkyl dimethylbenzene ammonium chloride Single exposure studies indicate that this material is moderately toxic to rats of swallowed (LD50 234 mg/kg) moderately irritating to rabbit skin (10%) and severely irritating to rabbit eyes (10%). The acute oral lethal dose in humans is 1,000 - 3,000 mg. Concentrated solutions are reportedly corrosive to eyes and skin and severely irritating to the repsiratory tract. Skin allergy has been observed in humans following exposure to this material. Inhalation of vapor or mist has been reported to cause lung effects inlcuding asthma, bronchoconstriction and bronchospasm. Accidental ingestion has caused central nervous system (CNS) effects such as headache, dizziness, nausea, drowsiness and muscle weakness. Following repeated dietary exposure, no effects were observed in mice, rats, rabbits, and dogs. No adverse effects were observed in long-term oral and skin exposure studies of this material in mice, rats and rabbits. This material did not increase the incidence of tumors in long-term oral studies in mice and rabbits. This material produced no genetic changes in standard tests using bacterial and animal cells.
